Egyptian Telephone Sponsors Trip to Washington, D.C. for Area Youth

Egyptian Telephone Cooperative Association sponsored Megan Schleifer of Okawville to attend the 25th annual Foundation for Rural Service (FRS) Youth Tour in Washington, D.C., June 1-5. The youth tour introduced the telecommunications industry to students from rural America with a legislative context. Aside from the educational aspects of the trip, students also had the opportunity to tour many of the historical sites in the nation's capital.

The trip featured a comprehensive overview of the telecommunications industry, including careers in telecom, the critical role telecommunications plays in rural America, and how legislative and regulatory decisions affect the industry.

This year, the youth tour brought together over 100 high school students, from throughout rural communities in the United States. Students arrived in Washington, D.C. for a



four-day, educationally and culturally enriching experience. The tour allowed youth to meet with members of Congress to represent rural constituents. They also participated in educational sessions about the Federal Communications Commission (FCC), the U.S. Department of Agriculture, the Rural Utilities Service (RUS), and more. Students visited some of the nation's most historic sites, including the Vietnam, Korean and World War II memorials, the Supreme Court, the Smithsonian Museums, Arlington National Cemetery, and the Lincoln and Jefferson memorials.

FUSC change – Effective on your August 2019 statement, the amount of your Federal Universal Service Charge (FUSC) appearing on your bill each month will change in the Federal Communications Commission's (FCC's) universal service fund contribution factor from 18.8% to 24.4%. The federal universal service fund program is designed to help keep local telephone service rates affordable for all customers in all areas of the United States.
