Treasurer Kenneth Hollman then gave his report. "We are confident to report that your cooperative is in strong financial condition," he said.

Matthew Bollinger presented the manager's report, focusing on some of the dangers members may face, including robot calls, telemarketing scams, phising emails, cyber security and AI. He also informed members of the cooperative's progress updating copper cables to broadband and government funding relating to fiber.

The board of directors announced the return of over \$250,000 in capital credits to members and checks were mailed in August.

After adjournment, 71 prizes were given away to members present at the meeting.
